

The Foundation for the Culture of Calligraphy

The Foundation for the Culture of Calligraphy – Stiftung Schriftkultur – was founded in 2016 by the well-known calligrapher, designer, lecturer and author Katharina Pieper, as a non-profit organisation based in Homburg, Germany. The Foundation (FCC) defines itself as an organisation acting internationally to promote and communicate the cultural heritage of calligraphy, writing, and typography (as well as handwriting) both as a means of communication and as art. Those who are interested in the calligraphic culture and all its related disciplines are welcome to join us. The following are the Foundations's specific objectives:

- Organising workshops, courses, seminars and lectures,
- Promoting publications and exhibitions on the art of writing and calligraphy,
- Initiating a lively discourse with calligraphers in Germany, across Europe and around the world,
- Encouraging children and young people to take an interest in the history of letterforms and handwriting.

Another important aspect is for us to establish a working relationship with artists in other disciplines, collectors, museums, libraries, universities, scientists, societies and associations. The Foundation was created on the conviction that calligraphy, and its artistic manifestation, is an important legacy to hand on to future generations.

GALLERY

New, spacious rooms have been created within the former barn in the eastern part of the Gut Königsbruch estate in Homburg. They provide an ideal atmosphere in which to present calligraphy. The Katharina Pieper Gallery is a new and unique meeting place for calligraphers and lettering enthusiasts. The gallery plans to show regularly changing exhibitions on the art of calligraphy and related disciplines.



JEAN LARCHER ARCHIVE

The great French calligrapher, Jean Larcher, passed away on January 17, 2015. This was not just an enormous loss to the calligraphic world, but also for his longtime life companion, Katharina Pieper. In 2014, she published the work of one of the last great writing masters, the book 'Traits de Caractère - Character Traits - Linien mit Character', which came out just a few months before his death. Jean's oeuvre is to be honoured by the FCC and will be preserved effectively through exhibitions, publications and public relations.

He has left a great legacy in his collection of books, original calligraphy, numerous original sketches, reproductions, prints, hand-written envelopes and teaching materials, which serves to illustrate his ingenuity and creative work. This extensive collection forms the basis of the archive named after him; a valuable resource for students and those interested in graphics, design, calligraphy and typography.

LIBRARY

Jean and Katharina's collection of books will be a starting point for the library, which will form a unique European collection of letterform-related literature. It will also house calligraphic journals from all over the world and provide a comprehensive array of posters, calendars, cards, ex libris labels, as well as numerous printed works. Original work by international calligraphers and lettering artists can be viewed and discussed during special library days. They may also be viewed by appointment at other times.


MUSEUM

In the vaulted cellar beneath the gallery and workshop space, a permanent collection of calligraphic artefacts is to be established. It will display all kinds of writing tools, writing fluids and other materials, as well as documenting an historical overview of the development of Western letterforms. Guided tours will be held regularly. We are looking forward to cooperating with schools and other educational institutions to help young people to understand a most important part of our cultural heritage. It is proposed that demonstrations and presentations about calligraphy for schools and other groups will eventually be added to the programme of events.

ACADEMY

Seminars, courses and workshops, lectures, exhibitions, museum and library visits are intended to promote the appreciation of calligraphy and handwriting. The newly designed rooms at Gut Königsbruch in Homburg offer both plenty of space and the right atmosphere for the study of calligraphy.

Historical, classical scripts will be taught from basic level upwards, towards using them in practical projects. Within the curriculum there will be several additional topics designed to increase calligraphic skills. Events will be organised regularly and themed workshops offered appropriate for all levels: beginners, intermediate and advanced. Katharina Pieper and other experienced lecturers are looking forward to working with you.



The Foundation's most important working partner, the German Newspaper Museum in Wadgassen, also offers an interesting and comprehensive teaching programme on the related subjects of printing, writing, paper making, bookbinding and newspaper design.

In the estate of Gut Königsbruch near Homburg / Saar, the Stiftung Schriftkultur e.V. found an ideal place to accommodate the gallery, workshop rooms, library, museum and the Jean Larcher archive.
